Pledge to the flag

Public forum regarding agenda items only. Several people spoke regarding the proposed wind turbines. Wendi Pencille spoke regarding the migratory route and how people come from all over to see the bald eagles and short eared owls and then visit our restaurants, shops and weekend markets. She talked about the EMF electro magnetic field (Flicker and strobe) how it can be debilitating. It affects people physiologically. People who live or work close to wind turbines have experienced symptoms that include decreased quality of life, annoyance, stress, sleep disturbance, headache, anxiety, depression, and cognitive dysfunction. She said no referendum was put before the taxpayers. She said the Town Board should not be Lead Agency as no one on the board has the expertise on either the environment or the physiological effects of EMF to determine detrimental effects from the turbines on the environment, or human physiology, and on quality of life. Other speakers-There were many speakers regarding the proposed wind turbines. Please see Youtube from the Town of Shelby website for all speakers and their

comments. The first speaker (Wendi Pencille) was not recorded on Youtube, therefore her comments are above.

Sherman Gittens, MRB Group, talked about the SEQR process. He started to go through Part 2 of the Full Environment Assessment Form. Some of the fields after conferring with the board were changed from No to low impact, to moderate to large impact may occur. A lot of time was spent on this. Councilman Wilkins said considering the time and how long we have been here and haven't gotten through the rest of the meeting would like to table the 2 resolutions for SEQR Resolution 98-22 and Resolution 99-22 until later date and also table the rest of the SEQR process until a later date.

Highway Report: (Dale Root) Fletcher Chapel, Ryan and some of Martin Road were swept and chip sealed with the help of Towns of Carlton, Clarendon, Yates. He thanked his men for their assistance. He said we wouldn't be able to do this work without the help of the town board and the taxpayer and he thanked them. Wants to keep the momentum going as he plans for next year. National Grid was here and we changed out the transformer and installed new service lines. Still need to install the highway new service lines into the building. They are still trying to get a date with the electric contractors and hopes it will be soon. Helped the county and town of Kendall through shared services to mill roads that they have been able to add to their pile of millings out back they will be useful for next year's paving projects. They were able to go around town grinding stumps and adding dirt to the holes. They went out with the county hot box and patched potholes-another day of work should complete that task. With all the tasks done and in between the other jobs we leveled millings at Shelby Fire Hall parking lot and installed the concrete block at East Shelby Fire Hall. Did the water samples and water flushing's and stakeouts. Also, never ending stacking of E-Waste.
